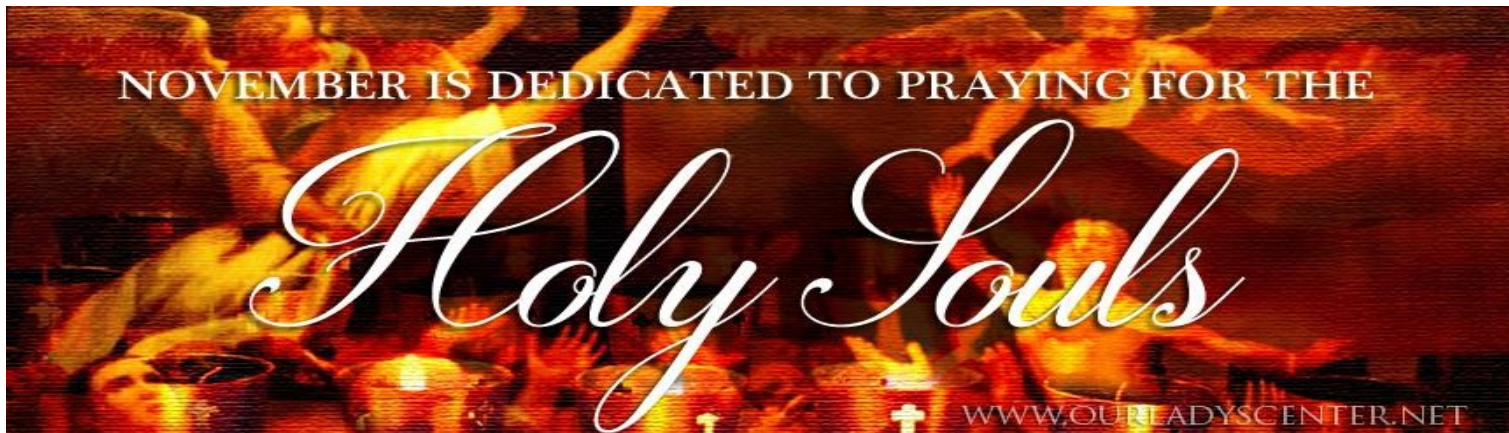

Thank you so much to everyone who participated in the **'40 Days for Life'** Prayers at Sacred Heart Church, Walkerton and also to those who prayed along at home. From the website, 40daysforlife.com we learn that worldwide, just during this past 40 day campaign, 588 babies were saved from abortion, (that we know of, and with reports still coming in). Since the first 40 Days for Life campaign in 2007, because of the prayer, fasting and keeping vigil outside hospitals and abortion clinics, by you and others like you, 19,518 babies have been saved, 114 abortion centres have closed and 222 abortion workers have quit their jobs.

Watch for an announcement next spring for the next **'40 Days for Life'** Prayer campaign, beginning on **Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022**, when we will once again be inviting you to join us to pray to save babies from abortion.

Walkerton & District Right to Life



With the exception of the last three days, the entire month of November falls during the liturgical season known as **Tempus per Annum** or **Ordinary Time** (formerly **Time After Pentecost**), which is represented by the liturgical colour green. Green is a symbol of hope as it is the colour of the sprouting seed and arouses in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection. The liturgical colour green is worn during the praying of Offices and celebration of Masses of Ordinary Time. The last portion of the liturgical year represents the time of our pilgrimage to heaven during which we hope for reward.

The last Sunday, which marks the beginning of **Advent**, the liturgical colour changes to purple, representing a time of penance. During November, as in all of Ordinary Time (time After Pentecost), the Liturgy signifies and expresses the regenerated life from the coming of the Holy Spirit, which is to be spent on the model of Christ's Life and under the direction of His Spirit. As we come to the end of the Church year we are asked to consider the end times, our owe as well as the world's. The culmination of the liturgical year is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. "This feast asserts the supreme authority of Christ over human beings and their institutions...Beyond it we see Advent dawning with its perspective of the Lord's coming in glory."

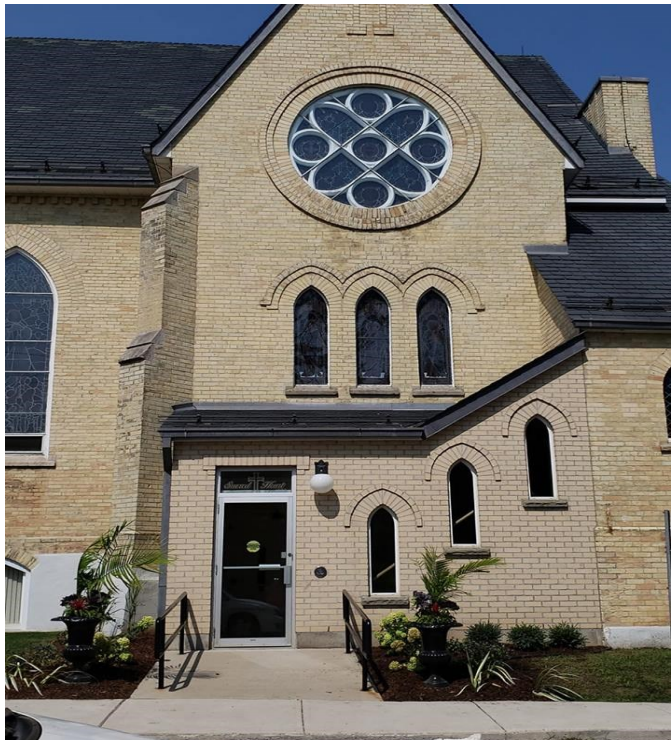

PARISH RECORDS: Please help us keep our parish records up-to-date. Advise the office if you are new to the parish or if you will be moving to a new address. Registration Forms are available at the office.

BAPTISM: Usually celebrated after Sunday Masses. Please call the parish office for details. Adults wishing to join the Catholic Church through Baptism or Profession of Faith should also contact the parish office for details.

FIRST COMMUNION: Usually celebrated with children aged 7 or 8 during the Easter Season. Contact the parish office for details.

FIRST CONFESSION (Reconciliation): Usually celebrated with children aged 7 or 8 during the Advent Season. Contact the parish office for details.

CONFIRMATION: Usually celebrated with young people aged 12 or 13. Contact the parish office for details.

MARRIAGE: Any Catholic who is presently a member of the parish, and who is free to marry, can be married at Sacred Heart Parish. Couples intending to be married are asked to please contact the parish office before making any final arrangements. A minimum of 12 months notice is required so that proper preparation can take place.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Celebrated communally in the Spring and Fall, and individually as required by contacting the parish office for details.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Celebrated communally during the seasons of Advent and Lent, and individually on Saturday afternoons at 4 p.m. or by appointment.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD:
Celebrated during Sunday morning 9 a.m. mass for children 8 years of age and under. Children under 4 must be accompanied by a parent. (Recessed for July and August)
